### **1. Membership Renewal**

We are happy to state that our chapter membership stands at 1665 active members as of 9<sup>th</sup> Sep 2025 with a renewal of 75.98% Member base with ISACA Certifications stands at 1632 (98%).

### **I. MONTHLY PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT MEETINGS (PDM's)**

We host monthly PDMs featuring industry experts discussing topics like IoT Essentials, Resilience Organizations, CI/CD Pipeline Management, Information Security, IT Audit, Cybersecurity, Risk Management, AI, Data Privacy, and Third-Party Risk. These meetings are well-attended. We also hold quarterly in-person PDMs to enhance member networking. The registration and CPE certificate processes are efficient, allowing instant certificate downloads post-meeting.

During the last quarter of 2023, ISACA Chennai Chapter kickstarted an innovative quarterly "Digital Trust" a theme-based Professional Development Meeting (PDM) journey. The Enlightening Quarterly Series (EQS), presented by the ISACA Chennai Chapter, is a significant initiative. ## **II. REVIEW CLASSES, SEMINARS & WORKSHOPS**

ISACA Chennai Chapter consistently offers insights into emerging areas and current topics by organizing relevant seminars and conferences.

1. 29th Jun - ISO 42001:2023 Five Days Lead Implementer Program  
Non IRCA – Jun 29, 30, July 6, 7 and 8

The program established guidelines for managing Artificial Intelligence (AI) systems responsibly and effectively.

- a. Provide a Framework for AI Management: It offered a structured approach for members to implement, operate, and maintain an Artificial Intelligence Management System (AIMS), ensuring AI technologies are managed systematically.
- b. Ensure Responsible AI Use: The standard promoted the ethical, transparent, and accountable use of AI, addressing issues like data privacy, bias mitigation, and security to build trust among stakeholders.
- c. Enhance AI System Performance: By setting best practices for AI system development and operation, this program helped members improve the reliability, effectiveness, and quality of AI solutions.
- d. Facilitate Compliance and Risk Management: The standard supported organizations in meeting legal, regulatory, and societal requirements, while also identifying and mitigating risks associated with AI systems.
- e. Support Continuous Improvement: ISO 42001 encourages ongoing evaluation and improvement of AI systems, fostering innovation and adaptability in response to evolving technological and market demands.
- f. Overall, this program helped in managing AI systems in a way that maximizes benefits while minimizing risks and negative impacts.

2. 12th, 13th and 14th Sep 2024 - ISACA Chennai Conference 2024

With the theme of “Redefining Digital Trust in the AI Era” with the tagline Strategic | Secure | Sustainable

As we delve deeper into the Artificial Intelligence (AI) era, the exchange between technology and trust has become a cornerstone of digital strategy. The “Redefining Digital Trust in the AI Era” conference was an essential convergence of global experts, innovators, policymakers, and industry leaders aimed at tackling one of the most pressing issues of

our times—building and maintaining trust in digital and AI-driven systems.

The conference addressed the multi-faceted challenges of digital trust through a comprehensive agenda that spans strategic planning, cybersecurity, and sustainable AI practices. Attendees will gain insights into:

- 1) Policy and Governance: How can we develop effective policies that govern AI without stifling innovation? What roles do transparency and accountability play in enhancing trust?
- 2) Ethics and Compliance: As AI systems become more autonomous, the ethical implications grow. We'll explore how organizations can navigate the complex terrain of AI ethics and compliance.
- 3) Technology and Innovation: With the rapid advancement of AI technologies, keeping security measures and trust mechanisms up to date is a challenge. This track will showcase the latest innovations that are setting new standards in AI security and trustworthiness.

3. 23rd Nov 2024 - One Day Seminar on Cyber Security Attitudes and Behavior Report and DTEF Primer
  - a. The National Cyber Security Alliance (CYBSAFE) released its 2024 Cyber Security Attitudes and Behavior Report. This session will concisely summarize the report, breaking down its eight parts and presenting four key approaches and recommendations to improve cybersecurity by Dr. Rama K Subramaniam
  - b. ISACA Digital Trust Ecosystem Framework Primer by Sriram Srinivasan

4. 21st Dec 2024 - One Day Seminar on SEBI Cyber Security and Cyber Resilience Framework
  - a. To enhance the cybersecurity posture of its regulated entities (REs) and ensure the integrity and stability of India's financial markets, SEBI designed the Cyber Security and Cyber Resilience Framework (CSCRF). It categorizes REs based on their scale and mandates tailored requirements for governance, risk identification, protection, detection, response, and recovery. The framework introduces a Cyber Capability Index (CCI) for maturity assessment, emphasizes third-party risk management, and requires robust incident response mechanisms. Compliance deadlines are set for early 2025, reinforcing global best practices in cybersecurity and investor confidence.
5. 1st Mar 2025 – Chapter Annual Members’ Day (Earlier called as Founders’ Day)

Members’ Day, previously called Founders’ Day, is the inimitable celebration of the Chennai Chapter. The day for each of us to gather as friends and families, recall the contribution of our founders’ and past presidents & volunteers of the chapter and enjoy a session of general interest is here.

Members’ Day was on March 1st, (Saturday) at Hotel Palmgrove.

#### 6. 20th Mar 2025 - India CIO Summit 2025

ISACA Chennai Chapter has supported Association Partner for the India CIO Summit 2025 happened at ITC Grand Chola on Mar 20 and 21, 2025.

#### 7. Oct 2024 - ISACA CommuniTY day Health Walk

This time, we celebrated ISACA Community Day on first Saturday of October by organizing a health walk! Here were the locations explored:

#### 8. Chapter Certification Training and Review Programs

ISACA Chennai Chapter has been a pioneer in conducting review programs and expanding the ISACA certified community for over 3 decades. We are also proud to state that approximately 30% of participants enroll are outside the state and country. ISACA Chennai Chapter conducts ATP Accredited certification review programs and helped many clear CISA, CISM, CRISC and CGEIT certifications. Last financial year, we had conducted 6 training programs and trained 61 professionals.

## **5. SIG (Special Interest Group)**

### **Program Purpose**

The Special Interest Group (SIG) within the ISACA Chennai Chapter is a dedicated community that focuses on sharing knowledge on specific areas of professional interests. The focused learning initiatives aim to enhance members' professional opportunities as they integrate the knowledge acquired onto their work deliverables. By fostering professional development, the SIG benefits its members and has far-reaching implications for the broader industry. Together, we learn to leap ahead.

### **Program Management**

The development of the SIGs began with the identification of 3 broad topics during 2024 and thereafter broadening the spectrum with the 4th topic during 2025:

- SIG 1: Emerging Technologies-AI & IoT (Bi-monthly)
- SIG 2: Data Privacy (Bi-monthly)
- SIG 3: Security Operations (Bi-monthly)
- SIG 4: Prompt Engineering (Bi-monthly)

These topics were communicated to chapter members, along with a form to indicate their preferred area of learning. Approximately 100 members expressed interest and around 80 members committed to dedicating 8 to 10 hours per month to their chosen SIG stream. The leaders from the prior year largely continued except for minor changes.

To ensure effective communication, communication groups were created for each SIG, enabling seamless interaction among group members and leaders. Meeting frequencies were largely bi-monthly among groups, with the week specifications depending on the interests and availability of their members. Attendance was tracked and submitted to the Director-SIG, and group meeting calendars were diligently scheduled by the leaders and shared with members. Through these efforts, the program gradually took root, establishing itself as a disciplined and effective learning initiative among the members.

The Director of the Special Interest Group (SIG) presented a clear mandate across all three groups: members were encouraged to actively research and present on topics they were eager to learn, with support and guidance from their respective leaders.

Over the past six months, the learning calendar for the four SIG groups has reflected the dedication and enthusiasm of the participating members. The pace of learning has been driven by the members' interests and involvement, with various individuals taking the lead in presenting their insights during sessions.

Our concentrated efforts had been recognized by ISACA Global by conferring the Innovative Chapter award to ISACA Chennai Chapter for the SIG initiative during 2025.

The prestigious award was presented at the North America Conference held during mid of May 2025 and received by our President Mr. Vaidyanathan Chandramouli. The award was showcased to all our members during a special in person session held at Hotel Maris on June 28, 2025. SIG has truly been a journey of its kind with rich learnings both on professional and member engagement spheres.

We also wanted to provide a platform for members to showcase their knowledge and writing skills. So, we planned to launch a series of

articles written by members, in the LinkedIn Newsletter of the research wing of ISACA-Chennai, which has about 2002 subscribers at this point.
